2018 Stationery Orders

This is another initiative to help our very busy families. Instead of heading out over January to source your stationery requirements for 2018, we have found a very reputable and reasonable Educational Supplier to create the stationery packs for each grade. The link will be live from Monday Week 4 for you to make your orders, you will be able to go onto the website, choose the school and grade and order the pack. The website link remains live until school returns next year. Please note that orders finalised before 15 December will be delivered to school ready for the beginning of the school year.

If you order after 15 December packs will be sent to your home address and there is a packaging and delivery fee of \$12.00.

The only other school supply that you will need to buy is a medium sized pencil case. We know that all children like their individual pencil cases so we did not include these in the pack.

Textbook Order 2018

Textbook orders will run similarly to the Stationery Pack order for 2018. There will be a website and code that will be provided to you later this term. Families will log on, choose the school and grade and pay online, If you choose not to pay online your child will receive an envelope at the beginning of Term One 2018. The envelopes need to be returned with money, cheque or credit card details to the school by Friday 9 February as *Harpers Textbook Day* is on Monday 12 February 2018. Once your textbooks have been paid for they will be sent home on that Monday ready for families to cover. We ask that the books be returned as soon as possible in that week.

Guidelines for the Election of School Captains and Vice Captains

- Candidates can self-nominate using a supplied nomination form. The form will ask questions relating to how he/she has demonstrated leadership as well as the capacity to lead. Responses must be handwritten and not exceed two pages.
- At a staff meeting, all forms will be tabled and will be determined to have or have not met the specific criteria according to the Student Leadership Framework for Primary Schools and a rubric for each of the four aspects.
- Captains and Vice Captains will be elected by staff and students. Years Two-Five students, current year School Captains and Vice Captains, House Captains and House Vice Captains and teachers will vote.
- One vote per person. A preferential ballot will be used.
- Parents will be informed of these guidelines in Term 4 in the Newsletter.
- A student will be ineligible for nomination if he/she has had to submit two Behaviour Reflection Sheets this year.
- A student will be ineligible for nomination if he/she has been reported to the Principal for misbehaviour this year and has warranted a Principal's involvement in a parent interview.
- All eligible voters will be familiar with these guidelines.
- If at any stage during their time as Captain or Vice Captain, any elected student is in breach of these guidelines, they will be replaced by the student with the next highest number of votes, after two warnings.
 Parents will be informed of all warnings.

2018 Nomination and Elections

Forms will be distributed to Year Five students on Wednesday 8 November (Week 5).

The nomination form must be submitted to Mr O'Connor by 3pm on Friday 17 November (Week 6).

A staff meeting will take place on Monday 20 November to determine who is eligible for placement on the election ballot according to the criteria.

Confirmation of nomination will be take place on Tuesday 21 November (Week 7)

Candidates will provide an electronic copy of the speech to Mr O'Connor prior to Friday 24 November.

<u>Speeches</u> will take place on: Friday 24 November at a special Year Two-Six Assembly at 11:45am.

Voting will take place on Friday 24 November.

Candidates will have a maximum of two (2) minutes when speaking at the assembly.

"My name is Clementine and I use to go to Kensington School and am very proud to have been a Kensington School girl.

Everybody knows that looking after our feelings is just as important as looking after our general health. Because with feelings you can't see them and you need to talk about them.

We all have different feelings every day they come and go, you can feel excited, silly, grumpy, angry, nervous, confused, lonely, happy or confident. These are some of the feelings we have every day.

What can we do when feelings are bothering us? We can talk to someone, write it down, read a book, sing in the shower, sit down and play our favourite game, draw, play sport, or we can count until we feel more relaxed.

Some people can have sad feelings and they don't go away. Sad feelings can stop us getting on with our lives. They can change how well we feel, how we behave, how we see the world and how we get on with other people.

I work in a place with grown-ups whose sad feelings have stayed around for too long and they have got too big for them to manage on their own. Mark is a 50 year old man who has sad feelings every day and he is not able to look after himself. He doesn't know when he should have a shower; wash his clothes or how to eat healthily. He needs carers to make him feel important and loved and to support him. Where I work some of the grown-ups will be staying in the place where I work over Christmas so that doctors and nurses can help them to start to feel stronger again. I want to make sure that these people are able to have a very special Christmas like you and I this year and that's why I have come here today, because I need your help.

I need Christmas decorations to be able to decorate the houses where these grown-ups are living.

Please could you all ask your Mums, Dads or Carers if they have any Christmas decorations which I could use to decorate these houses? There is a box for them to go in in the library. Even if you could find some tinsel or balls or other little decorations this would be very much appreciated."
