Please do not request a specific teacher. However, highlighting the preferred learning style of your child, from your perspective, does assist.

Our class placement policy is available below. However, whilst we try very hard to meet most requests, in what is a very complex process, not all requests can be fully met.

## Anaphylaxis

Anaphylaxis is a severe and sudden allergic reaction to certain foods such as nuts, shellfish or insect bites which can be life threatening. You must inform the school if your child has any known allergies. This is most important if an Epipen® has been prescribed, in which case a health plan needs to be drawn up in consultation with medical practitioners.

A number of children within the school are at risk of an anaphylactic reaction triggered by nuts. To ensure the safety of these students, we request that nuts or products containing nuts are not brought to school. Thank you for your cooperation.

# Guidelines for the Election of School Captains and Vice Captains

- Candidates can self-nominate using a supplied nomination form. The form will ask questions relating to how he/she has demonstrated leadership as well as the capacity to lead. Responses must be handwritten and not exceed two pages.
- At a staff meeting, all forms will be tabled and will be determined to have or have not met the specific criteria according to the Student Leadership Framework for Primary Schools and a rubric for each of the four aspects.
- Captains and Vice Captains will be elected by staff and students. Years Two-Five students, current year School Captains and Vice Captains, House Captains and House Vice Captains and teachers will vote.
- One vote per person. A preferential ballot will be used.
- Parents will be informed of these guidelines in Term 4 in the Newsletter.
- A student will be ineligible for nomination if he/she has had to submit two Behaviour Reflection Sheets this year.
- A student will be ineligible for nomination if he/she has been reported to the Principal for misbehaviour this year and has warranted a Principal's involvement in a parent interview.
- All eligible voters will be familiar with these guidelines.

 If at any stage during their time as Captain or Vice Captain, any elected student is in breach of these guidelines, they will be replaced by the student with the next highest number of votes, after two warnings.
 Parents will be informed of all warnings.

## 2018 Nomination and Elections

Forms will be distributed to Year Five students on Wednesday 8 November (Week 5).

The nomination form must be submitted to Mr O'Connor by 3pm on Friday 17 November (Week 6).

A staff meeting will take place on Monday 20 November to determine who is eligible for placement on the election ballot according to the criteria.

Confirmation of nomination will be take place on Tuesday 21 November (Week 7)

Candidates will provide an electronic copy of the speech to Mr O'Connor prior to Friday 24 November.

<u>Speeches</u> will take place on: Friday 24 November at a special Year Two-Six Assembly at 11:45am.

Voting will take place on Friday 24 November.

Candidates will have a maximum of two (2) minutes when speaking at the assembly.

## **Remembrance Day Service**

Our Remembrance Day Service to commemorate and remember those who have died or suffered in all wars, will be held on Friday 10 November at 11.30am. Parents, carers and friends are welcome to join us for the service.



After the service, student leaders will lay wreaths at Kokoda Park, Kensington. If you would like to donate a wreath for the service, please bring the flowers to the library on the day of the service.

The Vision Education Centre has been running at the UNSW Optometry Clinic for over 25 years and was established to offer a science excursion and health service to Primary School children. It was a fantastic opportunity for students to receive a comprehensive vision screening with an evaluation of their clarity of vision, focusing, eye tracking, eye health and colour vision.

It is important to have children's eyes examined regularly from an early age. Healthy eyes and vision are a critical part of their development as many vision problems and eye diseases can be detected and treated early. The visit emphasised the important role that eyes play in our lives and why we need to seek regular eye care.

# **Request for Christmas Decorations**

"My name is Clementine and I use to go to Kensington School and am very proud to have been a Kensington School girl.

Everybody knows that looking after our feelings is just as important as looking after our general health. Because with feelings you can't see them and you need to talk about them.

We all have different feelings every day they come and go, you can feel excited, silly, grumpy, angry, nervous, confused, lonely, happy or confident. These are some of the feelings we have every day.

What can we do when feelings are bothering us? We can talk to someone, write it down, read a book, sing in the shower, sit down and play our favourite game, draw, play sport, or we can count until we feel more relaxed.

Some people can have sad feelings and they don't go away. Sad feelings can stop us getting on with our lives. They can change how well we feel, how we behave, how we see the world and how we get on with other people.

I work in a place with grown-ups whose sad feelings have stayed around for too long and they have got too big for them to manage on their own. Mark is a 50 year old man who has sad feelings every day and he is not able to look after himself. He doesn't know when he should have a shower; wash his clothes or how to eat healthily. He needs carers to make him feel important and loved and to support him. Where I work some of the grown-ups will be staying in the place where I work over Christmas so that doctors and nurses can help them to start to feel stronger again. I want to make sure that these people are able to have a very special Christmas like you and I this year and that's why I have come here today, because I need your help.

I need Christmas decorations to be able to decorate the houses where these grown-ups are living.

Please could you all ask your Mums, Dads or Carers if they have any Christmas decorations which I could use to decorate these houses? There is a box for them to go in in the library. Even if you could find some tinsel or balls or other little decorations this would be very much appreciated."
