Farewell from Mr Rimmer

As you may know by now, I am moving to a new school next year which is a little bit closer to home. As I have said to a few people - if I could move the school another 40km west, I would! I have been truly lucky to have worked at Kensington Public School for 15 years. It is a truly wonderful school and it has been a privilege to work here. I have done some very basic calculations and I believe there are about 1000 students that I have taught in my time at KPS. What a great thing for me to say and know that I have impacted those children in that time (hopefully positively!)

I have taken on roles within the school that I have taken pride in. One of these was being the Technology Coordinator where we installed Smartboards, laptops, software programs (among others) to be used in our everyday teaching programs. Many of the hardware has been set up as a result of contributions from the very supportive P & C. Another facet of the school that gave me enormous pleasure was leading the schools' and the zone's PSSA program where I was President for seven years. I have coached many sports teams in my time here, including cricket, soccer, rugby league, oztag and AFL. Students showed great sportsmanship and it was never always about winning. There was one year, however, in 2014 where a very talented group of boys managed to win both the oztag and AFL competitions in the same year - a fantastic achievement that may not be repeated for a while! I was given the opportunity to coach regional cricket teams that represented at state carnivals. I travelled to places like Lismore, Dubbo and Orange to coach teams and experience a different side of teaching. This is just another great advertisement for the public education system.

I mentioned briefly above about the P & C. Over the years, there has been quite a few different committees but one common denominator has been the unwavering support for the schools' vision and direction. The resources that have been able to be purchased through contributions cannot go unmentioned. I know our parent bodies over the years have worked extremely hard to organise many school events - from election day barbeques, trivia nights, Halloween discos ... the list goes on. I do encourage parents to consider how you can help next year as all students benefit as a result. Speaking of parents, it brings a smile to my face to see many parent helpers reading with students as I walk along different corridors in the morning. It is such a supportive parent community and that is something that I will miss. I have had many well-wishes in the last week and that really means so much to me. It is very humbling.

There have been four Principals in my time at KPS and each one has encouraged me to be the best educator I can be. I am thankful for the opportunities they have given me and the trust that was imparted on me as I led different teams and programs. I am hoping to take a bit of each leadership style into my new school in my role as Assistant Principal.

I have been very fortunate to work with a highly dedicated, committed staff who have the best interests of their students as their one and only priority. I see them come into work on weekends, in the holidays and carry home trays full of work and marking as they leave. It is through this dedication that has helped our school become one of the leading educational institutions in the region when it comes to results.

Lastly, to the students. You have made my time here so memorable and enjoyable. Not a day goes past where I am not greeted by a friendly hello or a smile and that makes it all worth it. Pick Up Zone Reminders

Our Pick Up Zone has been designed to make it easier and safer for our community to collect children. In order for it to remain successful, we remind all families to recognise the following:

- 1. You may remain in the standing zone for up to 2 minutes.
- 2. You must remain inside your vehicle at all times.
- 3. Reversing your car in a school zone is unsafe and illegal.
- 4. Stopping in the No Stopping Zone at the corner of Doncaster Avenue and Todman Avenue is illegal and impedes traffic turning the corner. This also results in the crossing being blocked, preventing our students from crossing safely. Please only join the queue if there is space **before the No Stopping Zone**, otherwise complete another circuit and join the end when there is room to do so.
- Please cross only at the designated crossings. NEVER attempt to cross in front of cars in the Pick Up Zone.
- Staff priority is student safety. Please cooperate and follow all staff requests AT ALL TIMES TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF YOUR CHILDREN.

We are working with Randwick Council to ensure the cooperation of all community members. Fines may be issued for failing to comply.


We would also like to acknowledge the following students that raised over \$150 for our school:
