2018 NAPLAN Individual Student Report

National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) individual student reports for students in Years Three and Five are being sent home on Wednesday 26 September.

NAPLAN individual student reports provide information about what students know and have achieved in the areas of reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy. They also provide information on how students have performed in relation to other students in the same year group, and against the national average (over one million students participate in NAPLAN tests each year) and the national minimum standards. This year is the first year Kensington Public School students participated in NAPLAN Online testing. All tests, with the exception of Year Three writing, were completed online. NAPLAN Online uses tailored testing, where the test automatically adapts to a student's performance and asks questions that match their achievement level. This allows students to demonstrate their knowledge and provides teachers and schools with more targeted and detailed information on students' performance. 3 Super Simple Tips to Make Change

Your child's lunch box should sustain them and help with their mood, behavior and learning. If they're not used to a lot of fresh food, you'll need to introduce it to them. Here's my 3 super simple tips for making change and introducing healthier foods in your child's lunch box.

1. PHASE OUT THE PACKAGED FOODS

Add in a small amount of new fresh foods to your lunch box whilst gradually reducing the less healthy foods. E.g. if your child is used to having a muesli bar, a packet of chips, and maybe a piece of fruit. Start to add a vegetable in as well for a few days, then start to leave out either the muesli bar or chips in a few

2 FAT MORE OF THE FRESH AT HOME

What you have at home, is what children get used to eating. At home, he fresh fruit and vegetables available as snacks. Gradually start to buy less packaged food. For afternoon tea, give fresh fruit or vegetable sticks before allowing packaged snacks.

3. FIND HEALTHIER ALTERNATIVES

Choose one packaged item in the lunch box and find a healthier alternative. Do not rely on the front of the packet to tell you it's healthy. Read the back. Look for items with 10 or less ingredients. Sugar should be less than 4g (1 tspn) per 100g.

Kensington Public School Anti-Bullying Action Plan

Kensington Public School is an inclusive environment, where diversity is acknowledged and individual differences are respected. Our school rejects all forms of bullying behaviours, including online (or cyber) bullying by maintaining a commitment to providing a safe, inclusive and respectful learning community that promotes student wellbeing. No student, employee, parent, caregiver or community member should experience bullying within the learning or working environments of the Department of

At Kensington Public School, quality education is provided for students to meet their learning needs in a secure, ordered and supportive environment. Executive staff are committed to establishing evidence based approaches and strategies that promote a positive climate where bullying is less likely to occur. Partnership with parents, caregivers, students and the wider community is central to the success of this

Bullying is...

Bullying behaviour has three key features. It involves the intentional misuse of power in a relationship. It is ongoing and repeated, and it involves behaviours that can cause harm. There are four broad types of bullying: Direct physical bullying

includes hitting, kicking, tripping, pinching and

- includes nitting, sticking, tripping, pinching all pushing or damaging property.

 Direct verbal bullying
 includes name calling, insults, teasing, intimidation, homophobic or racist remarks, or verbal abuse.

- Indirect bullying

 is often harder to recognise and can be carried
- out behind the bullied person's back.
 is designed to harm someone's social reputation and/or cause humiliation.
- includes lying and spreading rumours, playing nasty jokes to embarrass and humiliate, mimicking, encouraging others to socially exclude someone, damaging someone's social reputation or social acceptance

- Cyberbullying
 is direct verbal or indirect bullying behaviours
- using digital technologies. this includes harassment via a mobile phone, setting up a defamatory personal website or deliberately excluding someone from social
- networking spaces. sharing others' private information without

Bullying is not...

Many distressing behaviours are not examples of bullying even though they are unpleasant and often require teacher intervention and management. The following are inappropriate behaviours but do not meet the definition of

- involves an argument or disagreement between people but not an imbalance of
- both parties are upset and usually both want a resolution. Unresolved mutual conflict can develop into bullying if one of the parties targets the other repeatedly in retaliation.

- Social rejection or dislike

 is not bullying unless it involves deliberate and repeated attempts to cause distress, exclude or create dislike by others. Single-episode acts
- single episode acts of of nastiness or physical
- aggression are not the same as bullying.

 if someone is verbally abused or pushed on
- one occasion they are not being bullied.
- nastiness or physical aggression that is directed towards many different people is not the same as bullying.
 However, this does not mean that single
- episodes of nastiness or physical aggression should be ignored or condoned as these are unacceptable behaviours requiring action as per school behavior management

Volunteer Ethics Teachers Required for Kensington Public School

Dear Parents and Carers,

Ethics classes are available at Kensington Public School as an option for children who don't attend Special Religious Education (SRE/scripture).

Ethics classes support children in developing skills in ethical reasoning, critical thinking, collaborative enquiry and how to support their arguments with evidence. The lesson materials have been approved by the Department of Education.

We do not have enough volunteer ethics teachers at Kensington Public School to meet the demand for classes in 2018. The more children and stages we have requests for, the more teachers are needed.

Volunteering is a great way to engage with the school. Volunteer ethics teachers do not need a background in teaching or ethics, just a willingness to learn how to deliver classes. They must complete a two-day workshop and other online training and accreditation requirements. The approved lesson materials are provided. Ethics teachers must commit to conduct classes each week at the school during school terms for at least one year.
