During the recent school holidays, I had the honour and privilege to visit Vietnam. One of the highlights was a visit to a small school in Hoi An, located in the centre of Vietnam, called Hearing and Beyond.

Hearing and Beyond in Vietnam (HAB) exists to help educate profoundly deaf children in Hoi An, and enable them to positively contribute to their community. Registered in Australia as a not-for-profit organisation, Hearing and Beyond in Vietnam was established by Mai McCann in 2008. Mai started as a self-funded volunteer in Vietnam in 2006 and saw the urgent need for assistance for deaf and hard of hearing children.

The school currently supports 40 students a day in a two-storey house that uses bedrooms as small classrooms, and the kitchen provides all students with a hot meal each day. I was warmly welcomed into the school by Mia and the delightful students. I came away hoping that into the future Kensington may be able to help this small school in some way. I will be speaking to our students at upcoming assemblies and I have provided the link below if anyone wishes to learn more about the school.

Grades will be applied to provide an overall achievement across each substrand of a Key Learning Area.

### 3. COMMENTS

Comments for each Key Learning Area will include a description of the learning activities students have participated in. In English and mathematics, comments will also include individualised learning goals. General comments will remain in the same format as Semester One.

# School Student Transport Scheme

The School Student Transport Scheme provides eligible school students with free or subsidised travel from home to school. School student applications for 2019 open from Monday 15 October 2018.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 do not need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to

https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.

# Volunteer Ethics Teachers Required for Kensington Public School

Dear Parents and Carers,

Ethics classes are available at Kensington Public School as an option for children who don't attend Special Religious Education (SRE/scripture).

Ethics classes support children in developing skills in ethical reasoning, critical thinking, collaborative enquiry and how to support their arguments with evidence. The lesson materials have been approved by the Department of Education.

We do not have enough volunteer ethics teachers at Kensington Public School to meet the demand for classes in 2018. The more children and stages we have requests for, the more teachers are needed.

Volunteering is a great way to engage with the school. Volunteer ethics teachers do not need a background in teaching or ethics, just a willingness to learn how to deliver classes. They must complete a two-day workshop and other online training and accreditation requirements. The approved lesson materials are provided. Ethics teachers must commit to conduct classes each week at the school during school terms for at least one year.
