Student School Leadership Guidelines

GUIDELINES FOR THE ELECTION OF SCHOOL CAPTAINS AND VICE CAPTAINS

Roles and Responsibilities of Captains and Vice Captains

School Captains are leaders of the student leadership team who support the school's executive (Principal and Assistant Principals) in delivering the school mission and vision. They develop student presence and voice within the school community and lead the student community in demonstrating citizenship throughout the school and across the wider community.

School Captains:

- Act as student leadership representatives at events such as assemblies, whole-school events and events where KPS is represented to the wider community;
- Conduct tours of the school for special guests. Attend and represent the school at extra-curricular events (e.g. concerts, award nights, ANZAC ceremony) and other events that may arise during the year as advised by Principal/AP;
- Independently investigate and develop other potential leadership opportunities, meeting as the need arises to organise events and develop self-devised leadership roles.

Eligibility of Candidates

Students will be eligible for nomination if they:

- Respect themselves and others including school property, as well as completing all school work to the best of their ability
- Act and speak honestly, as well as politely towards their peers, school staff and community members
- Engage in safe, friendly play and cooperate by working with other students and teachers
- Show consideration to the feelings and differences of others
- Uphold the KPS values of knowledge, honour and community
- Wear their school and performance uniform with pride and participate in all relevant school activities to their best ability
- Are willing to speak in public, address an audience, etc
- Participate actively in school activities
- Are positive role models at all times

Ineligibility of Candidates

- A student will be ineligible for nomination if he/she has had to complete **three or more** Behaviour Reflection Sheets whilst in Year 5.
- A student will be ineligible for nomination if he/she has been reported to the Principal for misbehaviour whilst in Year 5 which has warranted Principal support for the behaviour issue.
- If at any stage during their leadership tenor, any elected student who is in breach of these guidelines, will be replaced by the student with the next highest number of votes, after two warnings. **Parents will be informed of all warnings.**

Process of Selection for 2019 Nomination and Elections (for 2020)

- Candidates can self-nominate using a supplied nomination form (see Appendix A). The form will ask questions relating to four criteria: Initiative, Positive Impact, Community and School Improvement.
- Candidates must demonstrate how they have demonstrated leadership as well as the capacity to lead. Responses must be TYPED in size 12 Times Roman font and not exceed two pages.
- At an executive meeting with Stage Three teachers, all forms will be tabled and will be determined to have or have not met the specific criteria through the use of the KPS Leadership Rubric (see Appendix B. Also whether a student is eligible candidate)
- The four school student executive positions will be elected by students and staff. Years 2-5 students, current year executive team and teachers will vote.
- One vote per person. A preferential ballot will be used.

- The Student Leadership team can be any combination of genders. For example, the team could be a combination of males and females or all female or all male. The ratio is determined by the election results.

Bike & Scooter Safety

Children are reminded to walk their bikes and scooters on school grounds and it is their responsibility to lock and store their bike and scooter in the appropriate racks to keep them safe during the day.

Student Medical Details

If your child's medical details change it is **essential** that you contact the office to update your records. In the event of an emergency, these details guide staff to take appropriate action to ensure the safety and wellbeing of your child.

Before School Safety Reminders

A reminder that supervision of students commences at 8.30am. Prior to this time, parents/carers are responsible

for the safety and supervision of their children. Students are required to sit on the Library seats until the duty teacher arrives. We ask all parent/carers to model this behaviour so that all students see the right thing to do.

Reminder about NUTS

We have a number of students who are severely allergic to nuts. As per Department guidelines and KPS Student Wellbeing procedures, we ask parents NOT to pack NUT PRODUCTS (including peanut butter & Nutella).

If your child is anaphylactic, please send a safe, non-perishable treat for your class teacher to give out when special events such as birthdays are celebrated. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions. Thank you for observing these precautions to keep our students safe.

KPS P&C presents an evening with Professor ADRIAN PICCOLI on *How Can Your Child Get The Best Out of School*

KPS P&C has introduced a series of 'Education Matters' public talks for parents, teachers and the community by hosting prominent national and international experts in the field of education. The first event, *An evening with...* hosted by Dr. Pasi Sahlberg, received extremely positive feedback from attendees so we are pleased to announce **An Evening with Professor Adrian Piccoli** on Wednesday 30 October 2019 from 7-9 pm in the main hall of Kensington Public School.

This conversation will empower parents with knowledge and advice to help their children to flourish, do well and get best out of their education. What to look for when choosing a school? What to ask at parent-teacher interviews? How to manage screen time? What NAPLAN is and does it matter? Homework - why, why not, and how much? What does ATAR really mean? Managing screen time and much more.

Professor Adrian Piccoli is currently the Director of Gonski Institute for Education and Professor of Practice at the UNSW. Hon Piccoli is well regarded as the former Minister of Education for NSW (2011-2017) and a Member of the NSW Parliament for 19 years. He pioneered school funding reforms and is a strong supporter of Australian teachers, known for introducing the "Great Teaching Inspired Learning" reforms. As a passionate political activist he championed a focus on learning needs of disadvantage children, especially those living in rural and remote Australia. Professor Piccoli is also a Fellow of the Australian Council for Educational Leaders.

Volunteer Ethics Teachers Required for Kensington Public School

Dear Parents and Carers,

Ethics classes are available at Kensington Public School as an option for children who don't attend Special Religious Education (SRE/scripture).

Ethics classes support children in developing skills in ethical reasoning, critical thinking, collaborative enquiry and how to support their arguments with evidence. The lesson materials have been approved by the Department of Education.



We do not have enough volunteer ethics teachers at Kensington Public School to meet the demand for classes in 2019/20. The more children and stages we have requests for, the more teachers are needed.

Volunteering is a great way to engage with the school. Volunteer ethics teachers do not need a background in teaching or ethics, just a willingness to learn how to deliver classes. They must complete a two-day workshop and other online training and accreditation requirements. The approved lesson materials are provided. Ethics teachers must commit to conduct classes each week at the school during school terms for at least one year.
