

After School Safety

No students are to remain at school after 3.00pm unless they are waiting to be picked up. Ball games are not permitted after school as this has resulted in numbers of children leaving late to walk home or catch buses. KPS OOSH has use of the playground and all equipment from 3.00 (as part of their lease) and all other students and parents should vacate at this time, unless waiting for a specific purpose. An executive staff member will walk a circuit of the playground, encouraging students to leave the premises. From Monday 12 February there will be a new bell at 3.10pm as a reminder for parents and students to vacate the school grounds or as a reminder for a student that has not been picked up to go to the waiting gate, ensuring their safe supervision.

If waiting to be picked up, all students must wait inside the school fence near the Doncaster Ave gate (waiting gate). They must not play but watch for parents' arrival, so parents do not need to leave their car. **All other students and families are asked to exit via the Todman Avenue and Bowral Street**

gates to ensure a clear thoroughfare for children entering cars.

Parents taking children across roads are asked to observe all safety rules and apply common sense. What you feel is safe when you are with your child (ren), may not be for an unaccompanied child who follows / copies you. Calling to children to cross roads from the opposite side is **NEVER** safe.

Always use the crossings.

At 3.15pm all children who are still waiting to be collected will be brought inside, where they can be supervised by the teacher on duty. After 3.30pm parents/guardians will be contacted and if unavailable, emergency contacts will be notified. Children who are not collected after a reasonable time will be handed over to the Police.

Car Pick-up Procedures

Our Pick-Up Zone has been designed to make it easier and safer for our community to collect children. For it to remain successful, we remind all families to recognise the following:

1. You may remain in the standing zone for up to 2 minutes.
2. You must remain inside your vehicle at all times.
3. Reversing your car in a school zone is unsafe and illegal.
4. Stopping in the No Stopping Zone at the corner of Doncaster Avenue and Todman Avenue is illegal and impedes traffic turning the corner. This also results in the crossing being blocked, preventing our students from crossing safely. Please only join the queue if there is space before the No Stopping Zone, otherwise complete another circuit and join the end when there is room to do so.
5. Please cross only at the designated crossings. NEVER attempt to cross in front of cars in the Pick-Up Zone.
6. Staff priority is student safety. Please cooperate and follow all staff requests **AT ALL TIMES TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF YOUR CHILDREN.**

We are working with Randwick Council to ensure the cooperation of all community members. Fines may be issued for failing to comply.

GATE REMINDERS

Gate 1 Doncaster Avenue (nearest the canteen)

This gate is open from 3pm and is only for students accessing the Car pick Up Zone. To ensure the safety of our students, adult pedestrians are asked NOT to use this gate until after 3.15pm

Gate 2 Doncaster Avenue (nearest the basketball court)

This gate is open from 6am to allow access to KPSOOSH, before school activities and the administration office. At 3pm this gate is locked to avoid congestion on Doncaster Avenue.

Gate 3 Bowral Street and Gate 4 Todman Avenue

Both gates are open from 8am to allow pedestrian access for school drop off. These gates are locked at 9.15am. Volunteers exiting after this time should exit via Doncaster Gate 2. Both gates are open from 2.45pm to allow pedestrian access for school pick up.

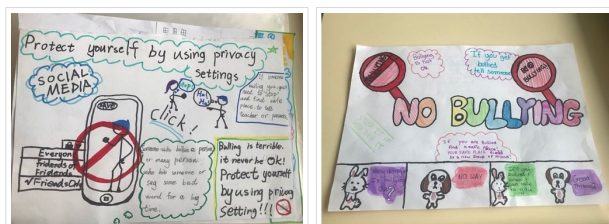
National Day Of Action Against Bullying

KPS is proud to be a registered National Day of Action Against Bullying School. On March 15 and throughout Week Seven, students at KPS participated in a range of activities to develop their understanding of bullying.

Below are some fabulous examples of posters our Stage Three students made to share strategies that can help others who might be affected by bullying behaviours.

Students also received special pocket cards with ideas and support networks to contact if needed.

Dear parents,

At Kensington Public School we aim to create a safe and supportive school community for everyone.

You are an important part of our work to prevent bullying and to respond effectively if it happens. Stopping bullying involves everyone.

Below are some tips from 'Bullying No Way!' outlining what to do if your child talks to you about bullying. Parents know their children best and know the best way to tailor communication to their needs. Adapt these tips to what works for you and your child.

If your child talks to you about bullying:

- 1. Listen** calmly and get the full story. Your calm response is important to allow your child to tell you all about the situation. After they've told you their story, ask questions to get more details if you need: who, what, where, when. Although you may feel some strong emotions about your child's experience, try to keep calm to avoid more distress to your child.
- 2. Reassure** your child they are not to blame. Many children blame themselves and this may make them feel even worse. You could say things like, "That sounds really hard to deal with. No one should have to put up with that." or "I'm so glad you told me. You should be able to feel safe at school, that's not fair at all".
- 3. Ask** your child what they want to do and what they want you to do. A critical part of your response is to avoid jumping in to solve the problem. While it is natural to want to protect your child, helping them to find their own solution is a better option. It helps them feel they have some power in the situation.
- 4. Visit** www.bullyingnoway.gov.au to find some strategies. The website has tips and ideas for different bullying situations. One idea is to practise strategies at home to help your child feel more confident.
- 5. Contact** the school. Your child may be reluctant for you to do this, so discuss the idea and reassure them that the school would want to know and is able to help. Make an appointment to meet with your child's teacher and, if you need to, ask to talk with the principal. Contact the school immediately if you have a concern about your child's safety.
- 6. Check in regularly** with your child. Keep the conversation going. It can take time to resolve issues, so check in regularly with your child about their experiences and their feelings. Your ongoing support is important.

Last week, all students 3-6 received a student pocket card with helpful advice to support them if they are affected by bullying. Parent cards are also available upon request.

VOLUNTEER ETHICS TEACHER REQUIRED

Dear Parents and Carers,

Ethics classes are available at Kensington Public School as an option for children who don't attend Special Religious Education (SRE/scripture).

Ethics classes support children in developing skills in ethical reasoning, critical thinking, collaborative enquiry and how to support their arguments with evidence. The lesson materials have been approved by the Department of Education.

We do not have enough volunteer ethics teachers at Kensington Public School to meet the demand for classes in

2019. The more children and stages we have requests for, the more teachers are needed.

Volunteering is a great way to engage with the school. Volunteer ethics teachers do not need a background in teaching or ethics, just a willingness to learn how to deliver classes. They must complete a two-day workshop and other online training and accreditation requirements. The approved lesson materials are provided. Ethics teachers must commit to conduct classes each week at the school during school terms for at least one year.

FRIENDLY REMINDER WHEN PICKING UP YOUR CHILDREN

All families who have their children attend OOSH have been notified that it is a legal requirement to leave the site immediately when signing your child in or out. For safety reasons, parents are not allowed to linger around our site and interact with other students before or after the sign in process as it goes against our regulations. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us. We thank families in advance for their co-operation.

BEFORE SCHOOL CARE SIGN-IN

If your child attends before school care please note that it is a legal requirement for them to be signed in by a parent or guardian. OOSH staff are not allowed to be signing in any students at before school care. We are not liable for your child if you drop them off at the gate and they make their own way to OOSH – you will need to accompany them to the centre and sign them in.
