P&C Parent Evening with Dr Pasi Sahlberg “LET THE CHILDREN PLAY! Why more play will save our schools and help children thrive?”

The P&C is introducing a series of public talks for parents, teachers and community by hosting prominent national and international experts in the field of education. The first event of **An evening with...** will be held on Wednesday, 4 September at 7 pm and will host Dr Pasi Sahlberg.

This conversational workshop opens a question “Why more play will save our schools and help children thrive?” The purpose of event is to present and discuss the play as the most effective and efficient way of deep learning and it will focus of the talk will be on the examples from Finnish schools as one of the best schools in the world.

Dr Pasi Sahlberg is a Finnish educator and author who has worked as a school teacher, teacher educator, researcher, education policy advisor and advisor on education reforms in Finland and around the world. He has written and spoken widely about these topics, his book “Finnish Lessons 2.0: What Can the World Learn from Educational Change in Finland” won the 2013 Grawemeyer Award for an idea that has potential to change the world. He is also a recipient of the 2012 Education Award in Finland, the 2014 Robert Owen Award in Scotland, the LEGO® Prize 2016 for his work to improve the quality of children’s education worldwide, and Rockefeller Foundation Bellagio Resident Fellowship in 2017. He is a former senior education specialist at the *World Bank*, a lead education expert at the *European Training Foundation*, a director general at the *Finland’s Ministry of Education*, and a visiting Professor of Practice at *Harvard University*. Currently, he is a professor of education policy at the *Gonski Institute for Education*, University of New South Wales in Sydney.

NCCD Information for Parents and Carers

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) is an annual process participated in by all Australian schools across the country. The aim of this process is to provide the Australian Government with consistent information about the number of students with disability in Australian schools and the type of adjustments they require in order to access and participate in education on the same basis as other students. The NCCD is used by the Australian Government to inform funding for schools, known as the ‘student with disability loading’.

If you are a parent, guardian or carer of a child with disability who requires ongoing adjustments at school, a teacher or another school staff member will consult with you to understand your child’s needs. This collaborative approach ensures the most appropriate adjustments are chosen to support your child’s learning and participation at school. In some cases, an individual education plan (IEP) or personal learning plan (PLP) may be developed to document specific educational goals and to review your child’s progress over time.

Your child will be included in the NCCD if they require ongoing adjustments at school due to a disability as defined by the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 This link will open in a new window (the DDA). This is a very broad definition of disability, which includes physical and intellectual disabilities, learning disorders such as dyslexia and dysgraphia, and mental health conditions such as anxiety and depression.

If your child has a disability, your child's school will provide information about them for the NCCD, including:

- your child's year of schooling
- the category of disability that best describes your child's difficulties (one of four categories is chosen by the school team to reflect your child's greatest area of need: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional)
- the level of adjustment your child receives at school (one of four levels is chosen by the school team to reflect the type of support your child requires: quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary adjustment, substantial adjustment, or extensive adjustment).

The information collected by schools for the NCCD will ultimately be provided to the Australian Government Department of Education and Training. In some cases this will involve the school passing the information directly to the Department. In other cases the school will provide it to its state or territory government agency (or other relevant body) in the first instance, and that agency will then provide the information to the Department.

While it is not possible for schools or families to 'opt out' of the NCCD, the privacy and confidentiality of all students and their families is treated with utmost importance. Data is collected within each school, and personal details, such as student names and other identifying information, are not provided to local or federal education authorities.

As per Department guidelines and KPS Student Wellbeing procedures, we ask parents NOT to pack NUT PRODUCTS (including peanut butter & Nutella). 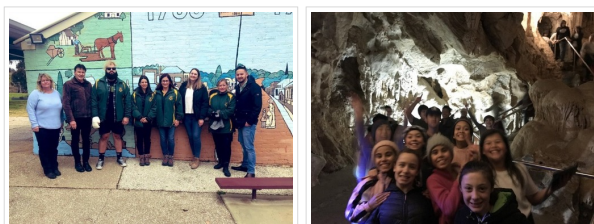
On day two, we travelled to Carcoar for the Complete Colonial Experience. This included a guided tour of Carcoar including activities in the courthouse, historical museum and hospital.

Healthy Lunch-box Tips

Children spend one third of their day at school so their lunch box should include one third of their nutrient needs. The lunch box is a tool for setting up healthy eating habits for life, so it is important to think about all the foods that are packed in the lunch box. Small steps can make a big difference.

- Serve fruit and veg in different ways: chop fruit in to small pieces; serve raw veggie sticks with a veg or yoghurt-based dip; pack salad for lunch; or add fruit and veg to baked goods such as muffins or pikelets.
- Try new foods at home after school before packing in the lunch box.

Kids need a serve of protein at lunch time so ensure you include lean meat, canned salmon or tuna, egg, beans, lentils, chickpeas or tofu.

“Bread tags come in many shapes, sizes and colors. Made of High Impact Polystyrene they have a good recycling value. It takes 200 kg of tags to bring in enough money to buy one wheelchair. Mary Honeybun founded the organization in 2006 in Cape Town. They provide 2 to 3 wheelchairs to adults and children around South Africa every month! Having a wheelchair gives the recipient independence and mobility and this makes a big difference to their families as well.”

We have a collection container right next to the sign in/out iPads in our OOSH room. If you are unsure about where to put them or you can't find the collection container, please pass on the bread tags to any of our OOSH staff members and we will place them in the container on your behalf. 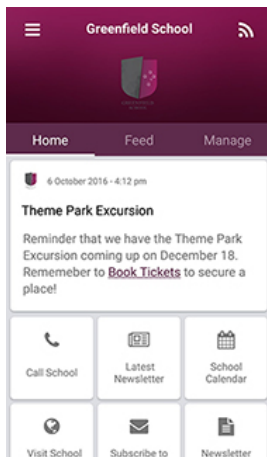
