#### **Class parents**

Ongoing research shows that "Students with involved parents or other caregivers earn higher grades and test scores, have better social skills, and show improved behaviour." Hence, our new logo...



We have found that WhatsApp is proving very effective in communicating class specific items as well as being a great tool for the P&C to request assistance with various events throughout the year. As a result, we will close the P&C Facebook account and



encourage parents to join a class-based WhatsApp group managed by the Class Parent Rep in each class. A form will be distributed for parents to complete at class sessions during the Parent Information Evening on 19-Feb.

#### Student Voice – Engaging with students

Research has shown that students who believe they have a voice in school are seven times more likely to develop better life skills, self-esteem, be more academically motivated, and have better critical thinking skills. The P&C is collaborating with the school on a new initiative for 2020 to better engage with student leaders and representatives, with the aim of listening to and supporting their ideas and activities regarding the P&C goals; Engagement, Community, Recognition.

#### K2K Development – Making it safe for our children

Randwick Council approved a decision in Dec-19 to significantly increase the apartment density near the school including four 18 storey buildings

An unprecedented high response rate from a KPS Parent Survey in 2019 showed that 92% believe the K2K Development Proposal will adversely affect the safety and wellbeing of children and staff that walk, ride or scoot to school as a result of traffic and congestion

Ron Hoenig (State member for Heffron) and Matt Thistlethwaite (Federal Member for Kingsford Smith) oppose over-development impacting school safety

KPS P&C has been successful in gaining a meeting with the NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment Minister's Office to discuss major concerns regarding the K2K Development proposal

Jock Marmotta and Philipa Veitch (RCC Councillor) will meet with DPIE 20-Feb to discuss the following alternatives:

- Limit height of buildings on the Eastern side of Todman Ave (towards the city) to 10 Storeys, and/or
- 2. Relocate these two, 18 storey buildings to the East Ward Area of Randwick near the light rail that stops at Avoca Street.

#### SQUARE - Making life easier

The Kensington P&C are transitioning to an easier (and more cost effective) method of



payment collection with the implementation of Square terminals in the Uniform shop (commencing Week 5) and at all P&C events.

## Student Wellbeing

#### Focus of the Fortnight



#### After School Safety

No students are to remain at school after 3.00pm unless they are waiting to be picked up. Ball games are not permitted after school as in the past, this has resulted in numbers of children leaving late to walk home or catch buses. KPS OOSH has exclusive use of the playground and all equipment from 3.00 (as part of their lease) and all other students and parents should vacate at this time, unless waiting for a specific purpose. An executive staff member will walk a circuit of the playground, encouraging students to leave the premises. A bell will ring at 3.10pm as a reminder for parents and students to vacate the school grounds or as a reminder for a student that has not been picked up to go to the waiting gate, ensuring their safe supervision.

If waiting to be picked up, all students must wait inside the school fence near the Doncaster Ave gate (waiting gate). They

must not play but watch for parents' arrival, so parents do not need to leave their car. All other students and families are asked to exit via the Todman Avenue and Bowral Street gates to ensure a clear thoroughfare for children entering cars.

Parents taking children across roads are asked to observe all safety rules and apply common sense. What you feel is safe when you are with your child (ren), may not be for an unaccompanied child who follows / copies you. Calling to children to cross roads from the opposite side is **NEVER** safe. **Always use the crossings.** 

At 3.15pm all children who are still waiting to be collected will be brought inside, where they can be supervised by the teacher on duty. After 3.30pm parents/guardians will be contacted and if unavailable, emergency contacts will be notified. Children who are not collected after a reasonable time will be handed over to the Police.

#### **Car Pick-up Procedures**

Our Pick-Up Zone has been designed to make it easier and safer for our community to collect children. For it to remain successful, we remind all families to recognise the following:

- 1. You may remain in the standing zone for up to 2 minutes.
- 2. You must remain inside your vehicle at all times.
- 3. Reversing your car in a school zone is unsafe and illegal.
- 4. Stopping in the No Stopping Zone at the corner of Doncaster Avenue and Todman Avenue is illegal and impedes traffic turning the corner. This also results in the crossing being blocked, preventing our students from crossing safely. Please only join the queue if there is space before the No Stopping Zone, otherwise complete another circuit and join the end when there is room to do so.
- 5. Please cross only at the designated crossings. NEVER attempt to cross in front of cars in the Pick-Up Zone.
- 6. Staff priority is student safety. Please cooperate and follow all staff requests AT ALL TIMES TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF YOUR CHILDREN.

We are working with Randwick Council to ensure the cooperation of all community members. Fines may be issued for failing to comply.

#### **Gate Reminders**

#### Gate 1 Doncaster Avenue (nearest the canteen)

This gate is open from 3pm and is only for students accessing the Car pick Up Zone. To ensure the safety of our students, adult pedestrians are asked NOT to use this gate until after 3.15pm

## Gate 2 Doncaster Avenue (nearest the basketball court)

This gate is open from 6am to allow access to KPSOOSH, before school activities and the administration office. At 3pm this gate is locked to avoid congestion on Doncaster Avenue.

#### Gate 3 Bowral Street and Gate 4 Todman Avenue

Both gates are open from 8am to allow pedestrian access for school drop off. These gates are locked at 9.15am. Volunteers exiting after this time should exit via Doncaster Gate 2. Both gates are open from 2.45pm to allow pedestrian access for school pick up.

#### **Bike & Scooter Safety**

Children are reminded to walk their bikes and scooters on school grounds and it is their responsibility to lock and store their bike and scooter in the appropriate racks to keep them safe during the day.

#### **Student Medical Details**

If your child's medical details change it is **essential** that you contact the office to update your records. In the event of an emergency, these details guide staff to take appropriate action to ensure the safety and wellbeing of your child.

#### **Before School Safety Reminders**

A reminder that supervision of students commences at 8.30am. As per Department of Education supervision policy, prior to this time, parents/carers are responsible for the safety and supervision of their children. Students are required to sit on the Library seats until the duty teacher arrives. We ask all parent/carers to model this behaviour so that all students see the right thing to do. Parents of students who are repeatedly at school before supervision commences will be contacted directly and alternative arrangements will be recommended.

#### **Reminder about NUTS**

We have a number of students who are severely allergic to nuts. As per Department guidelines and KPS Student Wellbeing procedures, we ask parents NOT to pack NUT PRODUCTS (including peanut butter & Nutella).

If your child is anaphylactic, please send a safe, non-perishable treat for your class teacher to give out when special events such as birthdays are celebrated. Please contact your child's teacher if you have any questions. Thank you for observing these precautions to keep our students safe.

#### Mobile Phones and Devices

A reminder that any students bringing a mobile device to school are required to read, sign and adhere to the KPS Mobile Device Acceptable Use Guidelines. These will be sent home at the Parent Information Evening. Please contact the office if you would like a copy. Students must take their mobile devices to the office as soon as they arrive at school or at 8.30am, whichever comes first. Devices may be collected at 3pm.

#### A Reminder about Toys

Students are encouraged to engage in creative, imaginative play at school. However, bringing personal items such as toys and games to school requires certain understandings. We encourage you to discuss the following with your child:

- Toys should only be brought to school with parent knowledge and permission
- Toys should be brought out for class presentations/ news time
- Toys that are distracting students from their learning will be sent home
- Any item brought to school carries a risk of being misplaced or damaged. Students should understand this risk and be guided to select items that are appropriate (Eg. Not valuable or highly sentimental)
- All items brought to school should be clearly labelled with your child's name
- Toys that may cause harm or offence are not permitted
- Trading of toys (including cards) is not permitted. Traded items will be returned to their rightful owner and sent home

## Volunteer Ethics Teachers Required for Kensington Public School

Dear Parents and Carers,

Ethics classes are available at Kensington Public School as an option for children who don't attend Special Religious Education (SRE/scripture).

Ethics classes support children in developing skills in ethical reasoning, critical thinking, collaborative enquiry and how to support their arguments with evidence. The lesson materials have been approved by the Department of Education.

We do not have enough volunteer ethics teachers at Kensington Public School to meet the demand for classes in 2020. The more children and stages we have requests for, the more teachers are needed.

Volunteering is a great way to engage with the school. Volunteer ethics teachers do not need a background in teaching or ethics, just a willingness to learn how to deliver classes. They must complete a two-day workshop and other online training and accreditation requirements. The approved lesson materials are provided. Ethics teachers must commit to conduct classes each week at the school during school terms for at least one year.
